God's Green Acre

Q: Where would you find a Hebrew Character, a Camomile Shark and a Striped Wainscote?

A: In a churchyard!

In the UK we have 59 species of butterfly, many of them familiar to us all, but did you know that we also have over 2,500 species of moth? Many moths have fabulous names. Some give a clue to their markings including Hebrew Character, China Mark, Garden Tiger or Orange Underwing. Others suggest possible frustration at identifying them, Uncertain or Clouded Drab for instance! Others give a clue to the food plant of the caterpillar, Appletree Skeletoniser or Bird-Cherry Ermine. And then there are names to let your imagination fly; Hoary Footman, Snout, Dusky Brocade, Scarce Dagger and Clifden Nonpareil for starters.

Most moths have evolved to fly at night in order to avoid predation, although they are the main food of bats, who have also evolved to fly at night. To avoid bats, some moth species can hear the eco-location used by bats and will zig-zag away or drop to the ground from mid-air when bats are close, to 'play dead' until the threat has passed. Whilst daytime predation of night-flying moths is reduced, moths and also their caterpillars are an important food item for creatures active in the day including small mammals, amphibians, spiders, lizards and many birds. Small moth caterpillars are fed in great number to the chicks of many of our common birds including blue tit, great tit, robin, wren and blackbird.

As with so much of our wildlife, moths are in trouble, down 28% in overall numbers since 1968. This is likely to be due to a combination of factors; agricultural change, increased use of garden and farming chemicals, development and also light pollution which has a profound effect on the lifecycle of moths. Churchyards, chapel yards and cemeteries can be a moth haven however. Many contain a mix of grassland, mature trees, scrub and flowerbeds, lots of different habitats, used by a wide range of moth species. Churchyards and other burial grounds are usually free of herbicides and pesticides which benefits all insects, including moths.

There are also small management changes that will encourage and support moths; similar to gardening for wildlife, be a little untidy! How about leaving areas with leaf litter, dead plant stems and tussocks for overwintering caterpillars and eggs. If you have flowerbeds or planters, how about introducing some night-scented flowers including honey suckle, tobacco plant, evening primrose and stocks. Is there an area of turf that can be allowed to grow long for 3 to 4 spring and summer months, providing meadow flowers and flowering native grasses for pollinators including moths? A particularly helpful change might be to reduce light pollution by keeping any outdoor lights low, pointing downwards and not on all night long.

Running a moth light trap overnight makes an interesting public event, the trap is opened in the morning, moths admired, identified and then released, but even if you do not manage to see these spectacular nighttime visitors, remember that our blue tit population need an estimated 35 million moth caterpillars every year and many people enjoy watching bluetits!

N.B If you are starting to identify moths, take a look at Moths Flying Tonight on the Butterfly Conservation website and put in your postcode to narrow down the moths you are likely to find.

A short update from me this month, I've had many residents contact and keep me busy! (And I'm glad you are!)

And I'll be away for a couple of weeks too this month.

I'll share a story that shows how brilliant it is when residents get in touch, share both their concerns and their knowledge, and when I get the right department working for us all here!





This pic may look like just a drain - it's FAR more than that! It's made me very happy this month and here's why...

Steve at The Red Lion contacted me a while ago about the frustrations around flooding down on the A4103. It took a while to get the right people out, but when they did, they listened and did some serious work to fix drainage to stop surface water coming right down the hill.

It was only when I popped into the Evergreen club in Storridge that another resident told me that despite all the work she'd seen clearing, there was ANOTHER drain that was completely covered over, she's lived here over 70 years and knew where it was - and showed me...

I let the drainage team know, they investigated and a few days later I drove past what had been -seriously- a patch of gravel, you'd never have known there was a drain underneath.

And there was this drain!!

So thanks to the Evergreen club and the lovely Chris Orford for meeting every 2 weeks so I could bump into Jean, and to Steve for alerting me in the first place, and Jean for collaring me with the extra info, and Jason and his drainage team, there is now a heap of unblocked drains and - fingers crossed - there will be less surface water in future.

So please:

Tell everyone you know that littering blocks drains - and pick up anything you see if it's safe so it doesn't get in our drains!

And if you know something that you think others don't - tell me, it might be worth it! I'll be away for a couple of weeks in June, thanks to those that came to my two early June surgeries and I'll have two again in July – First Monday in Cradley, First Thursday in Bishops Frome.





Minutes of the Annual Parish Meeting of Acton Beauchamp Group of Parishes held 21st May 2025 at 7.30pm at Stanford Bishop Village Hall.

Present: Cllrs D. Best (Chairman), D. Holly, G. Baynham, Clerk M. Alexander and x2 members of the public, Isobel Aitken & Alison Blank.

Apologies: Cllrs D. Reynolds (Vice Chairman), A. Elliot, County Cllr R. Tully, J & R Taylor and K. Smith.

Report of the Parish Council Chairman by Cllr D. Best:

Work being undertaken by the Parish Council to update Title Deeds and transfer the Trusteeship of Stanford Bishop Village Hall and Wooferwood Common from current Trustees to the Parish Council as a Corporate Trustee. This is being done in conjunction with legal advice and advice taken from Hfds Assoc. of Local Councils.

Stanford Bishop Village Hall – a structural survey has been undertaken which show that some remedial works are needed to the front elevation, rear elevation, ground levels and drainage system. Boundaries need to be clarified plus some investigative work to where it joins adjacent buildings. Electric meters and fuse boards need to be upgraded and kitchen equipment needs to be tested and /or replaced.

Neighbourhood Development Planning – a draft Plan has been commissioned working with a Planning Consultant and receiving funding from Groundworks UK.

Draft documents are currently being prepared, and a Steering Group of Parish Cllrs and residents has been formed (next meeting 27th May) to progress matters.

Parish Council notice boards have now been replaced with more modern and structurally sound oak ones.

County Councillor Report: The report received from Cllr Tully by email was read out to the meeting re Hfds Council matters.

Matters raised by the Public:

A new PCC is now in place for Stanford Bishop St James Church following a meeting held in January this year. There are now 7 people on the new PCC who were voted in at the AGM held on 27th March.

Details and key contacts can be found on the rear of the Frome Valley News. The church is a 'festival church' and will hold a minimum of 6 services a year. The first service held was very well attended and was a choral evensong.

The temporary bridge at St Giles church looked almost permanent but Hfds Council have now agreed to put a new permanent bridge in place.

There being no further business the meeting closed at 7.50pm

Appointment of Urgent Business Committee: It was unanimously agreed that Cllrs Best, Reynolds, and Baynham remain in this role.

Acceptance of apologies for absence: Councillor A. Elliot, County Councillor R. Tully. Apologies were unanimously accepted and duly noted.

Declarations of personal or prejudicial interests – Councillors were reminded of the need to update their Registers of Interests.

Confirmation of the minutes of the meeting held 24th March 2025: The minutes were proposed by Cllr Reynolds, seconded Cllr Best. All agreed.

Any matters arising from the minutes not itemised on this agenda: None.

Democratic Public Time: The meeting was suspended at this point to allow members of the public to address the Council on local matters: No matters were raised.

County Councillors report – Cllr R. Tully: A report had been circulated by email and had also been read out to the Annual Parish Meeting prior to this meeting.

Financial & Governance Matters:

Payments - proposed by Cllr Best, seconded Cllr Reynolds and agreed by all as follows:

M. Alexander - Clerk's salary and reimbursements April & May – salary £832.00 / mileage £32.40 / BT phone & internet £40.00 - Total £904.40

- P. Mansell Lengthsman fees £400.00 x2 = £800.00 (April (paid 1/5/25) & May now due)

Herefordshire Fire Protection Services – village hall fire extinguisher annual safety checks £86.32 – paid 24/4/25

Planning matters considered / **submissions made:** 241738 — Cross House Acton Green (additional information) — objection submitted as agreed. 250736 — Rockley Cottage, Stanford Bishop — no objections but with a comment re access to be considered. 250721 — Land at New Tynnings, Frome Manor, Acton Beauchamp — no objections raised. 250827 — Brook House, Bishops Frome — no objections raised.

Neighbourhood Development Plan updates: Cllr Best reported on work done to date and draft documents being prepared. A Steering Group meeting is to be held on 27th May to consider drafts. Funding received from Groundworks UK and which has not been used during the year to end

March 2025, has been returned to the Funder as per the contract (£2748.00). Further funding will hopefully be released in due course and will be applied for by the Clerk.

Highways Matters to be considered: P3 Parish Paths scheme – the footpath matters opposite Cllr Reynolds remain ongoing. The landowner may wish to apply for a diversion.

Parish Lengthsman scheme – work is ongoing, and Paul Mansell was thanked for doing a good job across our parishes. Action: the sign to Stanford Bishop Church needs to be repositioned and fixed in place please.

Hfds Council matters: No matters raised.

Stanford Bishop Village Hall & Wooferwood Common update: Cllr Holly reported on work that he had been asked to do regarding progressing the resignation of existing Trustees and was thanked for what he had done. The Clerk confirmed that following a recent meeting with the PC Solicitor, it appears that the trusteeships may have lapsed following a period of 4 years unless they can be shown to have been officially renewed. This means that we may now have two Trusts, neither of which have existing Trustees. The Clerk is to speak to the Charities Commission asap re how best to progress things if this is indeed the case, and how to appoint the PC as the new Corporate Trustee. It was noted that there may have to also be a number of named individuals, so this is also to be clarified. Further legal advice will also be needed, and it is now urgent to confirm resignations by letter from our Solicitor. The matter remains ongoing.

SABRE updates: K. Smith sent an email to the meeting but there are currently no actions ongoing.

Correspondence Received: A letter had been received raising concern about the possible burning of a Union Flag on the straw man at the recent VE Day event at Bishops Frome. It has now been confirmed that these were in fact VE Day flags and that it had been a genuine mistake. The Clerk and the Chairman had contacted Bishops Frome PC and the person concerned and no further action is required.
