Vicar's Letter

On the 23rd November our normal pattern of worship in the benefice will be suspended and we will join the rest of the Bromyard Deanery for a special Eucharist led by Bishop Richard in St Peter's church in Bromyard. The service starts at 10.30 and marks the end of the Diocesan Year of Engagement.

Most of you will probably wonder what the Year of Engagement is and why we are all gathering in Bromyard. To be honest, like all these initiatives that come from the top down, it can be hard to implement them in a local context when you already have a full programme of events in your churches. My approach generally is to look at what we are doing and how it matches what the diocese is after, then I just hammer that square peg into that round hole, job done! (Don't get me wrong, if we were doing nothing it would be a different story.)

When the Rural Dean asked me what the Frome Valley Group would like to share as an example of how we have been engaging with people over the past year, I had to stop and think. It didn't take me long to realise that across our churches the main point of engagement has been through music.

In Much Cowarne the concert with Gaudeamus brought many different people to church and is something they are keen to repeat. In Stanford Bishop we had over 90 people at a Choral Evensong with the Amici Quorum choir who have also sung in a number of other churches in the benefice. The Hereford Church Singers helped make the Patronal Festival at Ocle Pychard a success again this year as well as for a midweek mass for Our Lady of Walsingham in Bishops Frome. A music recital series in Bishops Frome has been running throughout the year and the Hereford Cathedral Choir came to sing Evensong there for the feast of St Matthew.

Looking forwards, we hope to welcome back the PAX Singers who faithfully come to sing at the Carol Service each year in Ocle Pychard, and Amici Quorum will be singing again at the Evesbatch Carol Service. Amici Quorum will also be singing Faure's Requiem at 6pm on Remembrance Sunday.

Music has been the one thing that has drawn people into our churches, for concerts and recitals, and also for worship, as it has for centuries. I am very grateful to all those who have made this possible across our benefice, our organists, the choir in Bishops Frome and all our visiting choirs and musicians.

At the service on 23rd November our contribution will be through music as Bishops Frome Choir joins with other choirs in the Deanery. Please do come and find out what the other churches in the deanery have been doing to engage with their communities throughout the year.





Did you know that we have one bell ringer left for the villages of Much Cowarne and Stoke Lacy? Mr. John Hodges is the Tower Captain for both churches and he now has to ask campanologists (bell ringers!) from Malvern and Bromyard to come and help out at festive occasions. Weddings in particular.

What is the commitment you might ask. Well, there is a rehearsal on Tuesday evenings at alternate churches from 7.30 p.m. until about 9.00 p.m. Then of course a practice and a peal on the special event days.

Village Trees

Hi I'm Roger. Some of you may have seen me mowing The Green and other grass areas around the village. I'm also a member of the parish council. As a council we have recently joined The Herefordshire Tree Warden Network and the PC in their wisdom, have appointed me as The Tree Warden for Bishops Frome. As some have been aware we are actively promoting new tree planting projects on PC owned land around the village as well as taking more care of existing trees and any other amenity environmental improvements (including levelling and reseeding the Old Cricket Field down to the river).

Our main project at present is planting a grove of decorative specimen trees for everyone's enjoyment. These will be in groups across the bank of the field which goes down to the river from the car park at the Community Centre. The area being considered is mostly along the line of, and below, the bench seats. It is planned that plantings will enhance, but not obstruct, the view from there.

This collection of trees will add to our village environment, and is planned to have year round interest for the enjoyment of any who cross the field, using the area for exercise, walking dogs, getting a breath of fresh air, or just to coming to admire the beauty of the trees as they mature. Interesting features will vary with the tree but could include flowers, leaf colour and size, bark, shape etc..

To do this we need the input of those who would like to be involved in the sponsorship, purchase and maintenance of individual trees. Sponsors can be individuals, groups or businesses with Bishops Frome connections. Accordingly the trees will be numbered and identified by species name. A record book will made available in the Community Centre with additional details of sponsors (should they wish it), planting date and any additional brief memorial message, if desired and relevant.

It is anticipated that selected trees, which we will order as a council, will be standard, single stem plants with about 6ft/2 metres above ground at planting. The package will include stakes, ties, guards, fertiliser and other growth aids plus our ongoing care. Cost per tree is expected to be between £50 and £100 depending on size and species. There is a book available on the table in the Community Centre giving some idea of our preferred species.

This season has presented us with a challenge whereby, because of the dryness of the ground, we have found it necessary to delay planting until at least the autumn, and planting will be ongoing from now. If you wish to be involved with planting and any further care you will be welcome. The actual layout and tree location will be supervised by myself with help from a highly qualified landscape designer. If you visit the area you may see the initial plantings will have taken place already.

Nature Diary

Our winter thrushes

Now is the time to look out for autumn migrants escaping the colder conditions of their distant breeding grounds. One of my favourites is the 'near threatened' redwing. It looks rather like a small song thrush, and you may catch one gorging on the berries in your garden, along with their larger cousin the fieldfare.

The redwing is a night-time migrant, navigating its way in the dark from Fennoscandia and Iceland. An extraordinary feat. Numbers of these migrant birds vary according to weather conditions and food supplies elsewhere.

If you venture outside on a clear autumn night, you may be lucky enough to hear the 'seep seep' call of a redwing above you. Such a treat.

TRUMPET PLOUGHING MATCH 2025

Marking its 80th year the Trumpet and District Ploughing Match was held near Bromyard hosted by David and Sue Watts. A great site with panoramic views of the Malvern Hills the Match was yet again a spectacle. With both horses and tractors ploughing, the event was well attended and blessed with good weather. As well as 78 Tractors ploughing there was the spectacle of 771 entries in the Domestic Section with classes as diverse as cakes & pastries, handicraft, photography and produce. Children's classes were well supported including entries from schools with four schools attending on the day to add to the vibrant atmosphere. Classes also included: Crop/ grain samples, Commercial Egg, Hops and the West of England Fruit Show for Apples, Cider Apples and Pears. A Trumpet Ploughing Match would not be complete however without the legendary roast lunch served by Elaine's Kitchen.

The next Trumpet event is the Christmas Charity Tractor Run on Saturday 13 December starting from Baddy Marsh Farm, Lower Eggleton. Tractors leave at 4.30 pm to travel through Bishops Frome, Bromyard, Stoke Lacy and Burley Gate and back to Baddy Marsh for Fish and Chips. Santa will stop in Bromyard to collect letters and donations can be made along the way which will go to local Charities. Last year's Tractor Run raised £3511 for St.Michael's Hospice.

On Sunday prior to the Match the Society held a celebratory lunch attended by over 150 people. To further mark the occasion, lunch was preceded by the Annual Plough Service, held in the tent rather in the local Church. Conducted by Rev. Steven Baggs from the Frome Valley Group and accompanied by Acton Beauchamp Organist Tony Wallis the service included the blessing of the Plough using water taken from River Frome.

Extracts of a speech given at the 80^{th} Celebration Luncheon by Tom Nellist who is in his 63^{rd} year as a member and 50^{th} as Treasurer. By his own admission he has lived through 19 Prime Ministers and SO FAR through 9 Trumpet Presidents, 4 Secretaries and 40 Chairmen!

On 21 October ,1944 The Ledbury Reporter and Guardian reported that the enterprise of the recently formed Trumpet & District Home Guard Hedging Society in organising their first annual Ploughing Match held at Marley Hall was "amply justified" this was preceded by a hedging match held in March 1944 at Priors Court. The Reverend Lt. Co. Toynbee who farmed Mainstone Court wanted to do something to relieve the misery of the war and from this wish the Society was formed.

The original Hedging match had a competition with a £4 first prize (£154 in today's money), to pleach, ditch and heather 12 yards of hedge in 6.5 hours, there was a pruning demonstration and a guess the weight of a pig – the prize being the pig! There was also a prize for the best thatched rick of hay or straw.

The Trumpet Match is recognised as one of the best one-day ploughing events in the country as witnessed by the number of ploughmen who travel from as far afield as Aberdeen, Penzance and the Isle of Wight to attend and all say how much they enjoy the day topped by the fantastic meal that Elaine of puts on.

One annual visitor who comes up from Somerset remarked "How that lady can put on a meal like that as good as my wife in the middle of a muddy field I shall never know"

The Trumpet was the first Society to reintroduce horse ploughing in the mid to late '60's due to the efforts of Archie Cowell and ploughmen Tom Pritchard and John Farrington. Our highest ever number of horse entries in that period was 20 including a team of mules.

The match depends entirely on the generosity of site of donors of which we have been very fortunate, no more so than this year with David & Sue Watts.

The Ladies Section started in 1951 and a young 18-year-old Mary Partridge, later to become Mrs. Neil Parker, was one of the first members, they are a fantastic bunch of ladies and it's mainly thanks to them that we always have a healthy bank balance. Mary is the Trumpet's longest serving member.

The 1992 Trumpet Chairman, John Gwilliam, became World Champion Ploughman in Rome in October 1960 and had an incredible Civic reception in Hereford and afterwards at The Foley Arms, Tarrington. John was one of three World Champions over the years from Herefordshire. There followed a toast to the Society.




